In the summertime I mentioned some movies that I watched and enjoyed. Now that we are back to school, here are some podcasts and books that I have been listening to/reading to help my mind be formed intellectually:

Pints with Aquinas (You can access by podcast app or on youtube)

These interviews are quite lengthy, so save them for a long commute into work or break them up into bite sized chunks. The ones that have peaked my interest and would recommend to you are:

June 21st - Freedom After a Homosexual Lifestyle with Kim Zember

When I preached last weekend about not conforming to the world but being transformed by the renewal of your mind, here is a woman who literally had that experience. It is honest, raw and vulnerable and gave me a lot of food for thought in ministry to those who experience Same-Sex Attraction.

June 23 - Catholic Infighting, Liturgy Wars, and Knowing Jesus with Michael Gormley

If you follow Catholic news and everything that is happening within the Church, this is a great listen. Michael Gormley is a passionate guy and a great evangelizer who communicates the message of the Gospel so well.

August 10 - Real Life Exorcist Shares His Story with Father Carlos Martins

If you have listened to the podcast, "The Exorcist Files" then this is a good follow up. I find that in this day and age, exploring how the evil one operates in our lives from the perspective of an exorcist will greatly assist us in the spiritual battle.

Understanding Gender Dysphoria By Mark A. Yarhouse (Book/Audiobook)

Given the rise in this topic in the news and the experiences of ministry that have been shared with me by various priests, parents, teachers/principals, youth ministers, I figured it is time that I inform myself a little more into this topic to assist me in my ministry as a priest. I listened to it as an audiobook which was helpful. Only pitfall of the book is that it was written in 2015 and the cultural landscape has changed dramatically. However, the foundations and studies of the book provide a good introduction into the topic.

Living Beyond Sunday: Making Your Home a Holy Place by Adam and Haylee Minihan and David and Pamela Niles

A short little book for any family that is getting back into the practice of the faith or a new family that is just beginning to grow the habits and virtues of family life. In all fronts, a good "Back to Basics" book that I would encourage any family to read and be formed into how to live as the domestic Church. (This book would have been a good resource when things were locked down and we talked a lot about the domestic Church...alas).

So there you have it, a little into my reading and learning. This also gives a glimpse into my mind and what I am thinking. Enjoy responsibly!

The Archdiocese of Toronto celebrates the feast day of our archdiocesan patron, St. Michael, on Friday, September 29, 2023. All are welcome to join in a special celebration on that day at 5:30 p.m. at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica (65 Bond St.). Archbishop Francis Leo will celebrate Mass, with music from the world-renowned St. Michael's Choir School. As part of the celebration, the Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, the Most Rev. Ivan Jurkovič will confer the pallium on our archbishop, a symbol of his role as Metropolitan Archbishop of Toronto and shepherd to the faithful.

Following Mass, there will be an informal reception with light refreshments in the St. Michael's Cathedral atrium and courtyard. Seating will be first come, first served. All are welcome to join in this special celebration for our archdiocese and archbishop!
