PASTOR'S BLOG

There was an event this week that made me incredibly sad...and I was filled with righteous anger. On Tuesday evening before Mass, a member of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul brought to me one of their envelopes that had the Blessed Sacrament in it. In the best possible interpretation of the *mens rea* of the person who did this, we think that they wanted to give Jesus to the poor. However, this is misguided. We receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and in turn are to be transformed into other Christs and sent into the world to bring Jesus to people by the way we live our lives. Thankfully, the Blessed Sacrament was not taken to some witches coven, satanic ritual or the Masonic temple behind the parish.

What this invites us as a parish family is to consume the Host in front of the priest/deacon. If we notice someone walking with the Host in their hands, we should politely and with charity ask them if they are Catholic and then kindly remind them to consume the Host. If they are not Catholic, kindly ask them to return the Host to you and you can bring the Host to the priest/deacon. This event also invites us to make some act of reparation for sacrilege committed against the Blessed Sacrament.

As I mentioned in previous blog posts, the month of October is a Marian month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. As we see the world descend into more bloodshed and violence with all the accompanying injustice, we are being invited to deepen our prayer life and turn to our Mother Mary to intercede on our behalf to her Son, Jesus. Maybe this week, turn off the “breaking news” and pray your rosary for peace in your heart and in the world.

But during this month dedicated to Our Lady, a few parishioners and I, along with many others, will be embarking on a Marian Pilgrimage to visit holy sites in France, Spain and Portugal. It is exciting for me because I have never actually been the priest to accompany a pilgrimage. This pilgrimage was originally planned for October 2020 and had to be cancelled due to the events of the world. So it is good that we are going ahead with it this year.

What makes it more exciting is the sites we will visit. The pillars of the pilgrimage will be our time in Fatima and Lourdes. The approved apparitions of Our Lady in both these sites have captured the hearts of many and have led to healing and devotion. And while we will have time to immerse ourselves into that history with all its spiritual benefits, we also will be travelling to other sites where we will visit the relics of saints and learn more about their contribution to the life of the Church. Hopefully the pilgrims and I will make a few more spiritual friends in the great cloud of witnesses.

So, while I am away on pilgrimage, Masses will be offered by visiting priests and to accommodate their schedules, there will be no adoration following our daily Masses. Daily devotions will remain.

Please pray for me and the pilgrims for a safe and blessed pilgrimage. Be assured of my prayers for the St. Mary's parish family.
