Hey parents!

Have no fear, God is here! Kids often snuggle blankets and favorite stuffed animals as they go to bed. Having a familiar object nearby brings a sense of comfort and peace. As adults, we often have that same longing for security. Infinitely more than a blanket or teddy bear, God can be our true security through life if we rely on Him.

Today your kids dug into the life of Elijah. Even though Elijah saw God work in miraculous ways, he still found himself tired, discouraged, confused, and scared. This week we studied 1 Kings 19:1-8, which records a dark season in Elijah's life. During this time, where was God? Right there with Elijah. God knew exactly how Elijah felt, He loved him, and took care of him. This passage of Scripture shows us the deep love of our Heavenly Father. When we encounter dark seasons, we can find comfort and courage in God's presence and His Word. If you're seeking comfort from our Good Shepherd, consider reflecting on Psalm 23 this week.

LET'S GO!

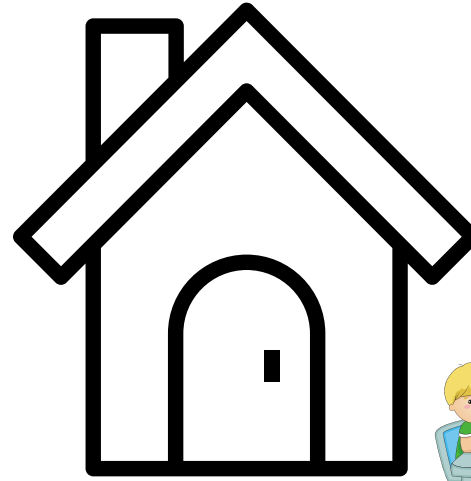

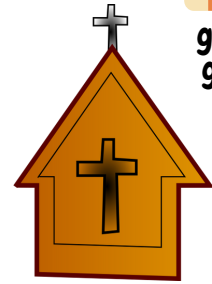

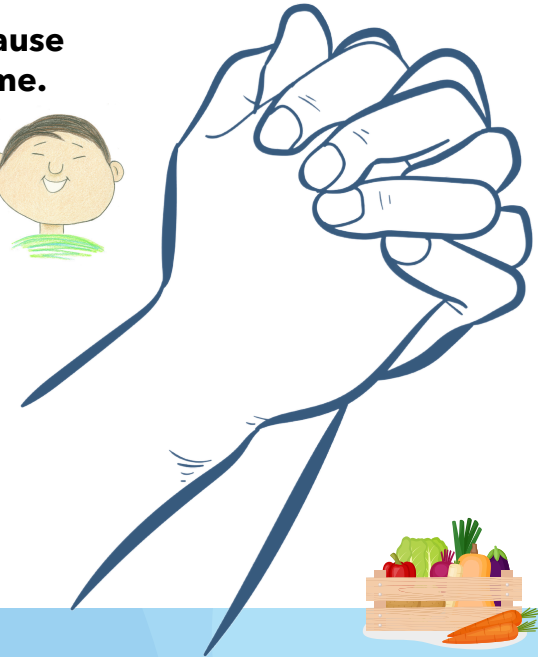
