Ways to Show Mom You Care

One of the most appreciated, yet challenging, ways to let your mom know you care is to say so. Here are a few ways you can do it:

1. Sing it.

If you have musical talent, you could write a song for her and sing it. Live is good, but don't sell a recording short—she can keep and listen to it over again.

- 2. Say, "I love you, Mom!" It's simple but effective.
- 3. Tell her how helpful her advice has been.

- Dedicate a song to her on the radio.

- 6. **Fix things in her house.** This is especially helpful as your parents get older and can't do everything for themselves.

- 8. **Make her dinner.** Show off whatever cooking skills you have and make dinner for your mom. Try to make it a little special. Don't forget to clean up the kitchen after!
- 9. **Give her quiet time.** A mother's life is often hectic. Find a way to give her some quiet time to do the things she'd like to do.
- 10. **Clean the house.** Yes, the whole thing. Get into the details. Hire a housekeeper for the day if you prefer.
- 11. Write a list. Write a list of things you appreciate about your mom.
- 12. **Write a poem.** Express how much you care for your mom in a poem. You can print it on good paper and frame it for her if you like.
- 13. **Print out your favorite quotes that make you think of her.** There are many online resources to find quotes, or just think up your favorites. Print them up and give them to her.
- 14. Make her a card. Make a card and make it special.
- 15. **Leave notes for her.** Write little notes about all the things you appreciate about your mom and hide them around her house.
- 16. **Take her to dinner.** Make a reservation just for the two of you.
- 17. **Take her some place special to you both.** Go together to a place that has meaning to both of you.
- 18. **Take her on a picnic.** Don't let her do any of the work. Plan out the picnic at a favorite local site and let her enjoy it.

4 Mothers from the Bible that had hearts of love:

I. Jochebed - Had the <u>-courage--</u> to Save Her Child (Exodus 2)

- God allowed Jochebed to raise three children that made an impression on the world spiritually. Aaron, Miriam, and Moses.
- God gave her a burning desire to see her children live for God.
- God used her to save the life of Moses—she sacrificed for her children.

II. Hannah - Kept Her <u>-vows--</u> to God (I Samuel 1:7)

1 Samuel 1:7 "Year after year it was the same—Peninnah would taunt Hannah as they went to the Tabernacle- Each time, Hannah would be reduced to tears and would not even eat."

- Hannah knew that God would change the situation as He pleased.
- Hannah ran to God in prayer.
- Hannah kept her vow to God, and Samuel became God's preacher in Israel.

III. Eunice - Displayed Unyielding <u>-faith--</u> (II Timothy 1:5)

2 Timothy 1:5 "I remember your genuine faith, for you share the faith that first filled your grandmother Lois and your mother, Eunice. And I know that same faith continues strong in you."

- We do not see her husband named in the scriptural account, but Eunice still trained Timothy spiritually (her husband was Greek).
- We see Eunice had a godly mother named Lois.
- The Scriptures refer to Timothy as if he was instilled with spiritual truth in his childhood.

IV. Mary - Committed to do ---God's-- Will (Luke 1:38)

Luke 1:38: "Mary responded, "I am the Lord's servant. May everything you have said about me come true." And then the angel left her."

- Mary was called to give birth to the divine Christ child (Her Saviour).
- Mary was calmed when she understood that this was God's plan (The Gospel plan).
- Mary submitted to God's will for providing a Saviour.
