Definition of a Spiritual Discipline

A spiritual discipline is an activity undertaken to bring us into more effective cooperation with Christ and his Kingdom.

Spiritual Reading

Spiritual reading is the discipline of openness to encounter God through the writings of the mothers and fathers of the church, beginning with the Scriptures. (Robert Mulholland)

Spiritual reading combats the powers of the information age by allowing God to control the narrative
