Happy Advent First Pres!

Our theme for this Advent is “Preparing the Way”. Throughout this season we are going to be working through portions of the book of Matthew. Not only will we reflect on how we participate in preparing the world for the light of Christ, but we prepare ourselves as we await his arrival. Advent is a tricky season because it truly is about waiting, and waiting is hard. I think about the Magi who travelled from far far away, and how long it took them to finally arrive where Christ was born. They heard the good news, and they had to wait to finally see the coming King. I think about the shepherds in field who saw the great light and heard the news of the Jesus’s birth, but they too had to wait and see what would come about. I think about Herod who waited in fear that this king might take his throne and usurp his power. And, I think about Mary and Joseph, especially Mary, who waited on the birth of the child she didn’t intend to have, but God did. And, not only did she wait, she had to travel a long distance to have this baby in Bethlehem. Waiting was hard for those in and near Jerusalem, and waiting is hard for those in and near West Chester. But, waiting is a discipline, it’s a spiritual practice, and we know throughout scripture that when we wait on the Lord, the Lord will indeed arrive.

We wait and prepare during Advent in hopeful anticipation that hope itself, that God Himself, will arrive. Thanks be to God that two thousand years ago God, Immanuel, arrived in the person of Jesus. This Advent we prepare our hearts for Christ’s birth, and we remind ourselves that two thousand years later, Immanuel is still with us.

Dear First Pres:

Advent is a time of preparation in every sense of that word: we prepare ourselves for Christ's birth, and that preparation is often tucked into the many tasks and to-do lists that arrive this time of year. Depending on where you find yourself, preparation may involve carols, choosing presents, baking, decorating, volunteering, or doing the impossible work of preparing one's heart to get through Christmas without a loved one. Sometimes we pastors make the mistake of encouraging people to push all of it (the good and the bad) away during Advent in order to better appreciate the gift of Christ's birth. But I don't think we humans have the power to push away life, nor do I think Jesus's presence depends on the absence of something else. Part of the message of Christmas is that Christ bursts – or more accurately, whispers – into our days as they are, whether they're full of cinnamon and glitter, overly quiet rooms, or ever-lengthening to-do lists. If we're not careful, finding Jesus becomes one more task we add to our plates, rather than simply allowing ourselves to see all the ways that he shows up right in the middle of the (often literal) messiness of life. My hope this Advent is that wherever we are, we'll have eyes to see how Christ makes himself known in this season, and throughout the year to come.

Pizza and a Parade



Chancel Choir

The Chancel Choir has been working on the D Major Mass by Czech composer Antonín Dvořák since September. The congregation has already had the opportunity to listen to the Kyrie and Gloria movements, accompanied by a wind quintet, during Sunday morning services this fall. The entire mass setting will be presented in concert as part of the 2026 Weekend with the Arts on Saturday, March 7, at 6:30 p.m.

Dvořák is mostly known for his symphony "From the New World." However, he also made significant contributions to sacred music repertoire, blending spiritual depth with Czech music traditions. His sacred music compositions include masses, motets, and art songs that reflect his deep faith and cultural pride. Notable works like the "Stabat Mater" and the "Requiem" showcase his mastery in choral writing, combining lyrical melodies with rich harmonies. Dvořák's sacred music often features lush, expressive textures that evoke reverence and contemplation. His spiritual compositions remain a vital part of choral repertoire, celebrated for their emotional intensity and spiritual resonance, illustrating his profound connection to faith.





Kids Christmas Pageant

At this year's Family Christmas Eve service (10am on 12/24), the children of First Pres will present "Don't Freak Out," a lighthearted yet meaningful re-telling of the Bible's Christmas story. Preschool – 5th graders will be preparing for the pageant during Sunday School in December. We look forward to another great morning of being led by our children as First Pres celebrates the joy of Christmas together.

Explore the Enneagram this Winter

At first glance, the Enneagram is a personality profiling system. However, that description comes woefully short of capturing the Enneagram for what it truly is: wisdom. The Enneagram is wisdom about nine types of human character - nine types identified most accurately through an understanding of a person's primary motivation and how that motivation impacts behavior because of how they see, interpret, and experience the world.

This aspect of the Enneagram distinguishes its value to people because it offers a dynamic quality of movement rather than a static description of personality. Rather than simply telling a person, "This is who you are and who you have been and that is just the way it is," the Enneagram offers opportunity. As one learns its wisdom, a person comes to recognize how their Enneagram type invites them to let go of the unhealthy action, attitudes, and patterns of their false self in order to move toward the health & wholeness of their true self in Christ.

It is this movement toward our true self in Christ that causes the Enneagram to integrate beautifully into our faith formation as Christians. Knowing our Enneagram type offers us greater insight into the vulnerabilities that want to lead us away from Christ as well as well insights into what will particularly aid us in our experience of Christ and our growth in our faith and relationship with God.

We are excited to offer this 6-week program starting on **January 7, meeting from 6:30 – 8:00 pm on Wednesday nights** over Zoom. The program will be led by David Bell, a trained Enneagram consultant and founder of Enneagram Insights.


