2023 Review

Attendance increase, compared to 2022 (425 average weekly attendance to 494).

Kids participated in the Great Hunt, serving 80 families.

People attended the return of Trunk R Treat.

total baptisms were celebrated in 2023, a significant increase from the 12 baptisms recorded in 2022!

The Christmas Eve attendance in 2023 reached 1138, marking the highest turnout since 2019 when it was 912!

Easter attendance had a slight increase of 1.8% compared to 2022 (949 to 966 attended in 2023)

Increase in group engagement (people attending), offering 42 opportunities to connect in small groups!

In 2023, we began mutually beneficial partnerships with Liberty Bible Academy and Josphua's Place (JP). JP offers "The Adult Development Food Cooperative" which allows members to receive approximately \$50 in groceries by paying \$5 and participate along with required adult development courses. Course topics include; parenting, financial literacy, health and wellness and many others. We proudly serves as the host for the Mason ADFC every other Tuesday, impacting the lives of 14 families each month.

Prayer Points: The current challenge revolves around giving and giving units, which have seen a decline since 2022. It's noteworthy to acknowledge that, on average, it takes 6-12 months for a new individual to initiate their contributions. Alan Baumlein, in reference to what he terms as "God Math," highlights the enduring pattern of things working themselves out or falling into place at Christ's Church. Whether it be in the form of financial support or provisions for events, there is a consistent pattern of resolution that underscores the faith and

resilience within our church.


