LOCAL PARTNER NEEDS:



Love's Arm works with women survivors of trafficking, prostitution and addiction, offering the assistance needed to exit the vicious cycle of sexual trauma and exploitation.

Items Needed:

Outreach Items:

- Chapstick
- Travel size hand lotion, body wash, shampoo, hand sanitizer, toothpaste & deodorant
- Disposable razors
- Individual size bags of chips
- Travel packs of tissues
- Individually wrapped tampons
- Granola bars or small boxes of raisins
- Snack packs of cracker sandwiches
- Individually wrapped meat sticks (like Slim Jims)
- Individually wrapped toothbrushes

Residential Items:

- Dishwasher pods
- Paper towels
- Toilet paper
- Laundry detergent
- Tissues
- All-purpose cleaner with bleach
- Disinfecting wipes
- Dish soap
- 13-gallon trash bags



LET'S STUDY.

"But thank God! He has made us His captives and continues to lead us along in Christ's triumphal procession. Now He uses us to spread the knowledge of Christ everywhere, like a sweet perfume." 2 Corinthians 2:14, NLT

Have you ever sat next to someone who smelled so good?! It's easy to want to ask what perfume they're wearing! The book of 2 Corinthians is actually a letter Paul wrote to the church in Corinth to encourage unity and to remind them what it means to be a follower of Jesus. In it, he gives the example that as believers when we submit to Christ, our words and actions can actually spread the fragrance, or aroma of Christ. What we do can make our lives "smell good"! It is only through Jesus' death and resurrection for us, which gives us eternal life, that the Holy Spirit in us equips us to live in victory through obedience to Him- we can't do it on our own. Wondering what kind of perfume Paul is talking about? The Gospels are full of the words of Jesus and examples of how He lived - both His words and His actions teach us how to spread the knowledge of Him everywhere.

DAY 01.

Read Matthew 28:16-20. These verses are referred to as The Great Commission. What does Jesus command the disciples to do in these verses?

The word “all” is repeated several times: Jesus has all authority, and He commands us to go to all nations and teach them all about Him. Jesus ends this passage by telling the disciples that He will be with them always. How does knowing that Jesus has all authority and will be with you always give you strength to follow the command He gives in this passage?

List three ways you can fulfill the Great Commission in your community this week.

DAY 02.

Read Mark 10:42-45. How does Jesus define greatness in these verses?

We can be tempted to believe life is a highlight reel of big moments when in reality the majority of our days are filled with small, insignificant moments. What does verse 45 tell us about Jesus?

Jesus is our example. He is the One we are following. He came to serve. List three ways you can serve in your day-to-day life.

DAY 03.

Read Luke 21:1-4. Jesus' perspective is very different from our perspective. He does not need what we offer Him but desires our whole hearts. Romans 14:12 tells us, "each (person) will give his own account (to God)." We will answer to God not for how much we give, but for how wholeheartedly we obeyed. Ask Jesus to make it clear to you one way you can use what He has given you (gifts, abilities, resources) to honor and obey Him.

How would giving wholeheartedly help you point others to Jesus?

DAY 04.

Read John 4:1-42. This passage describes Jesus' intentional encounter with a Samaritan woman. Jesus reveals Himself to and through unexpected people, often in unexpected ways and places. The Samaritan woman came to faith in Jesus, and her willingness to share her faith with others caused many in her community to also believe. Where has Jesus asked you to share your faith with others?

List 2-3 ways you can intentionally share the gospel with those around you.

LISTEN & RESPOND.

All believers are called to live a life of mission - to spread the knowledge of Him - wherever God has placed us. This requires faith and action. Re-read 2 Corinthians 2:14.

As you meditate on this verse, make the following your prayer:

Lord, thank you for the opportunity to know You personally and to share that knowledge with others. Lead me to see the people I encounter through Your eyes and to love them as You do. Equip me to obediently spread the sweet smell of your love and grace through my life today and every day.

In Jesus' precious and powerful name, I pray, Amen.
