## LIFE ESSENTIALS

Lesson 3

#### **CHRIST LIVING IN ME**

In our first lesson we discovered that God truly loves us.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only Son,
That whoever believes in Him shall not perish
but have eternal life."(Jesus Christ) John 3:16

This verse is often called the "golden text" of the Bible,

Likely because all Christians have discovered the vast love of God and have found Jesus Christ as their Saviour by it.

In our second lesson we began our discovery of who we are IN CHRIST, and how these truths provide the foundation for security, worth and value as a child of God.

In this session we will discuss:

- 1. How Christ lived when He was on earth.
- 2. How Christ lives on earth today.
- 3. What He provides and does in You.
- 4. How to respond to what you have learned.

### 1. HOW JESUS LIVED ON EARTH AS A MAN?

Jesus said:

"For I did not speak on My own initiative, but the Father Himself who sent Me has given Me a commandment as to what to say and what to speak." John 12:49

"Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father is in Me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on My own initiative, but the Father abiding in Me does His works." John 14:10

"I do nothing on My own initiative, but I speak these things as the Father taught Me." John 8:28

From these verses, what would you say:
Did Jesus ever do anything on His own?
On whom did Jesus, (the man) depend?
Where did Jesus get the words He spoke?
Through whom did God work?
During Peter's first sermon in Acts 2:22, Peter said:
"Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst,"
What did Peter call Jesus in this verse? a
According to this verse, who raised Lazarus from the dead?  According to this verse, who fed the five thousand?
In your own words, how did Jesus live while here on earth?
When Jesus showed Himself to his disciples, after His resurrection, He said amongst other things:
"Peace be with you; as the Father has sent Me, I also send you."  John 20:21
What was He saying? In the same way that the sent me to the world, with His living in me to depend upon, in the way, I, Jesus am sending you into the world, with living in you, so that can depend upon to do My work through
Jesus lived as a man was designed to live, by being totally dependent on the Father who lived in Him.
We are to follow Jesus' example, by being dependent upon Him.

"for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure."

Who is at work in you?	
Who does the choosing as to what should be done?	
Who does the work?	
For whose pleasure?	
How much room does that leave for you?	

So we conclude that God's supreme purpose is that Christ should be so working in us, that the world around us would see Jesus.

He lives in us to display His splendour in a dark world, and because He is the light of the world, He makes us to be that light.

So Paul says it this way in Romans 12:1

"Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship."

God's call to us is not for commitment of all that we have or are, but rather to surrender to the place where our bodies become temples in which Jesus can live. This surrender is to be made in the truth of the cross, whereby we submit to God as Jesus did to the cross, so that our lives (as we know them) can be set aside to be used by God however He pleases.

#### 4. HOW TO RESPOND TO WHAT YOU HAVE LEARNED

Suggested Prayer of Surrender:

Dear Father, I thank you for delivering me from life in Adam and placing me in Christ Jesus.

I see that in and of myself, I cannot live the Christian
Life, My desire is to know Christ, and allow Him to live His life in me.

I now give up on my self-sufficiency and do hereby surrender my life unconditionally into your hands. I give You permission to make me into the kind of person you want me to be.

I believe Your Word that I, my old self, has been crucified with Christ, has been buried and has been raised with Him into newness of life. I

What power did Paul use to do his work of ministry? Colossians 1:29
"For this purpose also I labour, striving according to His power, which mightily works within me."

Philippians 3:3 "for we are the true circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh."
How much did Paul trust in himself?
Who can overcome temptation? I Corinthians 10:13
"No temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man; and God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be able to endure it."
How can we overcome temptation? that God provides.  Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life."  Who then enables us to overcome temptation?
How do we overcome the flesh, that is our own resources and ways? Romans 8:13 "for if you are living according to the flesh, you must die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live."
Who is it that overcomes the flesh in us.?
If we try on our own to overcome our fleshly ways, we will fail. (must die)
Who is it that does God's work? Philippians 2:13

Therefore, He took up residence in me, so that He could live His life for me, through
Don't try to live your life for Him. Jesus wants to live His life in you.
The secret is to learn how to trust Him by breaking away from the way you have learned to trust in yourself. God makes provision for that too!
2. HOW CHRIST LIVES ON EARTH TODAY
To make it possible for Jesus to live through me, something has to happen to get "me" out of the way.
That is where Galatians 2:20 becomes a very important verse;
"I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me."
The principles truths in this verse are extremely important for us to experience the miracle of Christ living in us, here on the earth, while we are here.
Let's look at this verse in segments.
The first line of this verse tells us that someone else died with Christ at the same time as Christ died. Who was it?
What part of me was crucified with Christ?  Our body is still here, so that's not it. Stroke it off.  We can still think, feel, and make decisions, that's our Soul, and we can still do that.  So, it must have been our Old Spirit, the one we got from Adam. Circle that one.  Spirit Soul or Body?
God's word says in Romans 6:6;  "knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin;"  Same truth, only here the old me is called theself, or the old, depending on which translation you use.  Why were we made to die with Christ in this verse?
