Like Any Man

Therefore if there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion, make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose. Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.

Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Philippians 2:1-8 (NASB 1995)

Paul urged the church onto unity through humility and emptying ourselves of anything that is not of God. How did Jesus do this, he became a man. In case you are wondering, God and man have some differences! God is omnipotent, omnipresent, and omniscient.

God is omnipotent. Merriam-Webster defines as omnipotent as “one who has unlimited power or authority.” God cannot be stopped, slowed, or defeated. As God, Jesus has this incredible power. In fact, after the crucifixion and ascension, Jesus said, “All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth (Matthew 28:18).” All the power of God was restored.

However, Jesus became a man...for us. Jesus prayed on earth like any man, had a body that needed sustenance to survive like any man, and was tempted like any man. Finally, he was falsely accused, beaten, mocked, and killed on a cross as any man could have happen to them. Humanity meant humility.

God is omnipresent. Merriam-Webster defines omnipresent as “present in all places at all times.” God stepped into history with Jesus. In humility, Jesus walked in time, on earth, like any man. One early church father said, “He became like us, so we could become like Him.” Jesus was limited to a three-year ministry. He had to walk from place to place with His disciples. He wore himself out because His time on earth was limited like any man.

God is omniscient. Merriam-Webster defines omniscient as “possessed of universal or complete knowledge.” Jesus followed faithfully while waiting for the Father to unveil His entire plan for Him, like any man.

We are not omnipotent, omnipresent, or omniscient. We are limited. However, like Jesus, we can use the limited power and authority we possess to lift others who need us. We can use our limited presence to bless others where we are today. We can use our limited knowledge to make kingdom decisions here on Earth. Amen.

"At the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?' which is translated, 'My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?' (Mark 15:34)." Jesus pleaded with His Father as he hung on the cross. These words aren't just spoken vainly in a vacuum. Jesus was pointing back to Psalm 22. This Psalm of David was not only a prophecy of the Messiah giving His life, but it appears David was Seeing Through Jesus' Eyes on the cross!
