Did you have an opportunity to enjoy the Labor Day Weekend? Sunday, after worship, we came home, ate quickly, packed, loaded the boys, and let the dog in the car. I backed out of the driveway and we headed on the very familiar path to my hometown.

Since we had the whole crew, the departure time was pushed back from what was originally planned. No need to route it in the Maps App. This was familiar territory. We headed up to I-435 West, exited on Highway 10, and looped around Lawrence.

In Lawrence, we faced an unexpected amount of construction, but kept pressing forward. Next, Topeka had construction that forced us to take the long loop around Topeka on I-470. At the last second, we noticed the exit and took the detour. My dad had told us they like to drive south of Clay Center and get to I-70 at Chapman to avoid driving through Manhattan. I decided to avoid Manhattan construction, so I tried this route. Since I wasn't sure of the right exit off of I-70, we entered the destination in Maps so we could see the directions.

The Maps told us to exit too soon, and head further north, but I knew better. At every county road, I was told to turn north, but I ignored it.

I knew these county roads that I've been driving for nearly forty years, so I drove on. Finally, we arrived at the direct route to my hometown and we were greeted with a sign that said, "No Thru Traffic." From this point, I let the Maps reroute us home. Somehow the app knew better than me. My experience was no match for road construction.

I am reminded that no matter how many years we have been a church member, no matter how many decades ago we repented and accepted Jesus, we still need God's guidance. We often think we know what to do...been there, done that. So, by experience, we do what we know if right, tried and true. However, we still need God's guidance! God has much better anticipation of the road ahead.

You are NEVER too old to pray for discernment. You are NEVER such a seasoned Christian that you don't need to read words of wisdom and direction in the Holy Bible. We should also be surrounded by wise counsel.

God knows what is coming beyond the next hill. Ask for His good guidance. Seek His will. The road of life has unexpected twists and turns. We need the Wonderful Counselor each day. Prayer, scripture, and wise counsel help us when we need to take a new path. Let us listen and discern.
