



5 Day Easter Devotion

This five-day devotional will explore the Easter message in greater depth, focusing on the central theme of Jesus' resurrection and its transformative impact on our lives.

Day 1: *1 Corinthians 15:2-4*

Day 2: *1 Corinthians 15:14-15*

Day 3: *Romans 6:4*

In Romans 6:4, Paul illustrated how the resurrection not only confirms Christ's victory over death but simultaneously offers us a new life. As we participate in His death through baptism, we also embrace the reality of being raised to a new existence. This profound transformation entails leaving behind our old selves and habits, stepping into the freedom and daily renewal that comes through our identification with Christ. The resurrection leads to a life infused with hope, purpose, and direction for what God calls us to accomplish.

This new identity invites us to live out a faith that resonates with the joy and power of the resurrection in our everyday lives. We become ambassadors of hope, sharing the transformative message of Christ with others, demonstrating that the resurrection holds not just theological significance but practical consequences. Living in resurrection life means continuously choosing to align ourselves with God's will and refraining from the patterns that seek to bind us to our past.

- Ask for strength to shed old habits and stepping into your new identity.

Day 4: *John 11:25-26*

The promise of eternal life resonates deeply within the context of the resurrection. Jesus assures us that He is the resurrection and the life, anchoring our faith in the hope of what lies beyond this earthly existences. His resurrection not only guarantees our future with Him but also redefines how we view death and life itself. Instead of fearing death, we can embrace it as a transition to a more profound existence in His presence, thus alleviating the burdens we often carry related to mortality.

This profound promise gives us the courage to face each day with renewed vigor and purpose. It invites us to live fully in the present while remembering that our lives have eternal significance. Through this lens, we are driven to share the Gospel message with urgency, providing others with the hope of resurrection. - Spend time thanking God for the assurance of eternal life.

Day 5: *Matthew 28:19-20*

The Great Commission invites us to actively participate in spreading the message of the resurrection. After the resurrection, Jesus charged His disciples with the monumental task of sharing the Gospel with the world. Our acknowledgment of the resurrection should propel us into action, compelling us to equip ourselves to share this life-altering truth with all nations. We are not merely recipients of this gift; we are called to be heralds of the hope we carry.

- How can you actively participate in the Great Commission in your community?

- In what ways can you better embody the love of Christ in your interactions?

- Pray for boldness in sharing the message of the resurrection.
