“Do Not Be Afraid of the Beast”

HIS KINGDOM COME - PT 10

Revelation 12:18, Revelation 13:1-18, 2 Thessalonians 2:1-10

1. Jesus exposes the counterfeit kingdom.
2. Jesus limits the beast from acting outside of God’s supreme authority.
3. Jesus reveals how the beast competes for your allegiance.
4. Jesus prepares His people to endure patiently and remain faithful.

CONNECT > ENGAGE > SERVE

Small Group Meeting Guide

Big Idea:

Jesus prepares His church to recognize a counterfeit kingdom that competes for their allegiance so they can remain faithful to Him.

Connect and Engage:

- Take a few minutes for each person to share a recent high and low.

Read Revelation 13:1-18.

- This passage can be a bit challenging to read. What emotions or thoughts come to mind as you read it?
- The question is not, “Can you spot the beast?” but instead, “Where are you tempted to give your allegiance to other than Jesus?” What are some ways culture encourages us to shift our allegiance from Jesus, and how can we resist those influences?

Apply:

Endure doesn’t mean barely hang on. It means understanding you’re here on purpose for God’s kingdom. What might that look like in your everyday life? How might your choices, habits, and priorities shift if you lived out the decision that you belong to Jesus?

Pray:

Pray that our allegiance would be firmly settled in Jesus, letting His authority and kingdom shape how we live.
