HEBREWS 10

• Jesus' one sacrifice superior to annual animal sacrifices (1-10)

- 1. Yearly animal sacrifices insufficient to remove sin & guilt (1-4)
- 2. Jesus' sacrifice once for all a sufficient replacement (5-10; Ps 40:6-8)

Jesus' service superior to priests' service (11-14)

- 1. Priests stand & continually sacrifice (11)
- 2. Jesus sacrificed once & "sat down" with Father, crushing enemies (12-14; Ps 110:1)

Jesus' new covenant (15-18)

- 1. Obedience to law by Spirit (15-16; Je 31:33)
- 2. Total forgiveness by gospel through Christ (17-18; Je 31:34)

Review: Jesus is superior to

- 1. Prophets because He's the Word
- 2. Angels because He's God
- 3. Moses because He's the Son
- 4. Priests because He's perfect
- 5. Sacrifices because He's sufficient...

• Therefore, Christians have (19-21)

- 1. Confidence to enter heaven by Jesus' blood through His body (19-20)
 - Like entering Most Holy Place with blood through curtain (Ex 26:31-35; Mk 15:38)
- 2. Priest in Jesus over Church (21)

• And Christians should (22-25)

- 1. Approach God confidently, guilt-free & cleansed (22)
- 2. Hold on without wavering (23)
- 3. Stimulate others to love & actions (24)
- 4. Not abandon gathering together (25)
- 5. Strengthen others for faith & obedience as Judgment Day approaches (25)

Intentional, continual apostasy unforgivable (26-31)

- 1. Rejects sin's only sufficient sacrifice—Jesus (26)
- 2. Brings judgment (27)
 - Like rejecting OT laws (28-29; Nu 15:30-31; Dt 17:2-7)
 - From God Himself (30-31; Dt 32:35-36)

• Remain faithful amid persecution (32-39)

- 1. As in past (32-34)
- 2. For future reward of heaven (35-39; Hb 2:3-4)

Nero's (54-68 AD) persecution of Christians

- 1. Supposedly started fire in Rome to rebuild areas
- 2. Accused Christians to divert attention (64 AD)
- 3. Crucified, burned at stake, & fed Christians to dogs dressed in animal skins



HEBREWS 11

- Interpretation (what verse means—1 meaning)
- Application (how to use verse—many uses)
 - 1. ISWEEP: Instruction, Sin, Warning, Example, Encouragement, Promise
- Faith in God defined (1-2)
 - 1. Confident hope
 - 2. Proof or certainty of invisible
- Faith in creation by God (3; Ge 1-2)
 - 1. Seen with insight (Ro 1:20)
- Faith in God displayed by (4-31)
 - 1. Abel's offering (4; Ge 4:2-8)
 - 2. Enoch's life (5-6; Ge 5:21-24)
 - 3. Noah's construction of Ark (7; Ge 6-9)
 - 4. Abraham's (8-19)
 - Move to Promised Land (8-10: Ge 12:1-9)

 - Passover ritual during 10th plague—death of firstborn (28; Ex 11-12)
 - Crossing of Red Sea (29; Ex 13:17-14:31)
 - 9. Joshua's battle of Jericho (30; Js 6)
 - 10. Rahab's protection of spies (31; Js 2)
- Faith in God also displayed by (32)
 - 1. Gideon—defeated Midianites using only 300 men (Jg 7)
 - 2. Barak—defeated Canaanite chariots on foot (Jg 4-5)
 - 3. Samson—defeated Philistines after losing sight (Jg 13-16)
 - 4. Jephthah—defeated Ammonites after being cast out by family as son of prostitute (Jg 11)
 - 5. David—defeated Goliath with slingshot (1 Sa 17)
 - 6. Samuel—defeated Philistines & had peace (1 Sa 7)
 - 7. Prophets throughout OT
- Faith in God displayed by many others (33-40)

HEBREWS 12

- Because of faithful examples & like Olympian (1-3)
 - 1. Get rid of all impediments & constricting sin (1; Co 3:5)
 - 2. Endure (1; Ja 1:12)
 - 3. Focus on Jesus since He (2-3; 2 Co 4:16-17)
 - Is "Captain & Champion" of faith
 - Endured opposition, focusing on future
 - Finished His work & rules (1:3, 13; 8:1; 10:12)

• Suffering (4-13)

- 1. In form of loss of respect & property, not blood--yet (4; 10:33-34)
- 2. As form of love, as God's sons (5-9; Pr 3:11-12)
- 3. To grow spiritually more like God (10-13; Ro 5:3-5; Ja 1:2-4)
 - Exercised in righteousness & peace (11)
 - Be strong so weak in faith don't fall away (12-13; Pr 4:26; Ro 15:1-2)

Witnessing by being (14-17)

- 1. Peaceful & holy—so people can "see" God (14; Mt 5:16; Ro 12:18)
- 2. Forgiving, without bitterness—so people can "see" God's forgiveness (15; Ep 4:31-32)
- 3. Faithful to spouse & God—keeping "inheritance", not rejecting it like Esau for temporary relief (16-17; Ge 25:29-34; 27:34-38)

• Don't return to Mt. Sinai—the Law (18-21; Ex 19:10-25)

- 1. Physical emphasis (18)
- 2. Frightening (18)
- 3. Condemning (19-21; Ex 19:12-13; Dt 9:19)

Stay on Mt. Zion—the Gospel (22-24)

- 1. Spiritual emphasis (22)
- 2. Joyful (22)
- 3. Saving (23)
 - Church of firstborn—believers with privileges as God's children (23)
 - Jesus' blood of mercy rather than Abel's blood of vengeance (24; Ge 4:10)

• Fear God (25-29)

- 1. Israel was judged for rebelling (25)
- 2. World will be judged (26-27; Hg 2:6)
- 3. His kingdom will endure forever (28-29; Dt 4:24)

HEBREWS 13

• Final Commands (1-19)

- 1. Have brotherly love (1)
- 2. Use hospitality—like Abraham (2; Ge 18)
- 3. Remember persecuted (3)
- 4. Save sex for marriage (4)
- 5. Be content & don't love money—God provides (5-6; Dt 31:6; Ps 148:6-7)
- 6. Follow your spiritual forefathers' examples—consistent Christian living (7-8)
- 7. Avoid false teachings—remember grace saves, not law (9-10)
- 8. Suffer for Jesus—we have something better to look forward to (11-14)
- 9. Praise God always (15)
- 10. Live righteously (16)
- 11. Submit to & obey spiritual authorities (17)
- 12. Pray (18-19)

• Benediction & closing (20-25)
