THE LESSON AT A GLANCE

In this week's lesson, we'll explore the account of Jesus healing a man born blind. This narrative strikes at the heart of a common question: Is my suffering, or the suffering of a loved one, a result of sin?

As you discuss this topic, keep a few things in mind. (1) Everyone suffers because we live in a fallen world broken by sin. (2) While some suffering may be a direct result of sin, this is not always the case, as we see in today's story, or in the story of Job. (3) God uses suffering in the life of a believer for our sanctification, but also to bring about our ultimate (eternal) good.

As people share their own stories of suffering, look for ways to express care and compassion. The most important thing we can do is not answering the "why" of suffering, but pointing to Jesus, "a man of suffering knew what sickness was" (Isaiah 53:3).

THE MAIN IDEA

Jesus gives sight, physically and spiritually. Those who acknowledge their spiritual blindness receive sight; those who don't remain in darkness.

QUESTIONS TO EXPLORE

How can you recognize and confront an area of spiritual blindness in your own life by responding to Jesus in faith and worship?
